#### **RULES**

- 1. All entries and awards in the department will be subject to the General Rules and Regulations published in the exhibitor's information, including the following rules.
- 2. **Entries:** The show is open to all exhibitors. There is a limit of (4) four animals that can be entered in an individual class by an exhibitor. Exhibitors will be restricted to (2) two placings in each individual class.
- 3. **Eligibility of Animals:** All breeding goats must be registered in the Herd Book of the American Boer Goat Association, The original registration certificate is required. Animals must be registered and owned in the exhibitor's name.
- 4. Ennobled Herd Book Points: Goats entered under its ABGA registration number and presenting its ABGA Certificate of Registration will be eligible to earn points for its actual placing in the show as described in the ABGA "Criteria for the Ennoblement of a Boer Goat."
- 5. **Tattoos:** All goats must have legible tattoo(s) or other means of permanent identification consistent with its registration certificate. Illegible tattoos or tattoos inconsistent with registration papers will result in disqualification. If the animal has a microchip as its permanent identification, the exhibitor is responsible for providing a microchip reader.
- 6. **Computing Ages:** Birth dates, as listed on the registration certificate, will be used to determine the class division. The base date is the date of the show.
- 7. Classes: All animals must be registered purebred, full blood, or percentage blood boer goats. Percentage doe classes are for goats 25% to 87.5% (1/4 to 7/8 blood) boer; fullblood classes are for does that are 93.7% and higher; and 96.8% and higher for bucks. Progeny of fresh does will not be allowed in the ring. The Champion and Reserve classes will be chosen from the first and second place animals in that division of the show.
- 8. **Disqualification:** Any goat showing any pronounced defect or abnormality will be barred from the show in any of the breeding classes. Artificial coloring will be a disqualification. Illegible tattoos or

tattoos inconsistent with registration papers will result in disqualification. Any doe over 24 months of age that has not kidded and cannot prove a current pregnancy will not be allowed to show.

- 9. Only one person per goat is permitted in the ring.
- 10. Substitutions are allowed in the same class and same show as the original entry. Please make substitutions at check-in. Group class entries are to be made at check in.
- 11. Exhibitors will check registration papers at the office upon their arrival. The certificate of registration for the animals shall stand in the individual or family farm name making the entry of which the exhibitor is a participant.
- 12. All goats must be housed in pens assigned to exhibitors. Any exhibitor failing to house their entries in the goat barn from the time of arrival until the shows have been completed will be ineligible to compete.

# FEED, BEDDING AND SUPPLIES

First Bedding will be furnished for beef, poultry and rabbits. Sawdust and sand are not to be used for bedding, due to the difficulty in disposing of manure containing these materials.

As a service to exhibitors Management has contracted with a concessionaire to make available for purchase grain, hay, straw and some miscellaneous supplies. The store is located under the viaduct across from the Gilligan Livestock Complex (Horse Barn). Prices must be posted and be in line with the retail market of this general trade area. All purchases made during the show must be from the feed concession. No outside vendors will be permitted to make deliveries on the fairgrounds.

Exhibitors may provide their own feed, but are **not permitted** to sell to others, **nor** may they store feed in aisles or block aisles with service vehicles.

Exhibitors purchasing feed and bedding from the concessionaire must not have a remaining balance. All items should be paid for upon initial purchase. Any remaining balance with concessionaire will result in release slip not be given until balance is paid.

Exhibitors must keep pens and aisles clean and in order, along with keeping their animals clean and well cared for, as a part of their contribution to the Ohio State Fair. Exhibitors must place manure outside of the building in area provided for loading. Manure *must not* be left on the ramp or platform. Exhibitors neglecting to do this will be warned for the first offense. Premiums and special awards won shall be forfeited for further neglect and lack of cooperation. Only animals placing first or second in their individual classes are eligible to compete for championship rosettes and trophies.

# FIRST AID CENTER

Management will maintain an equipped first aid center staffed by paramedics with stretcher golf carts to provide emergency treatment and reference facilities for accidents and illnesses occurring on the grounds.

If an illness or injury is severe or additional medical attention is necessary, the Columbus Fire Department Emergency Squad will be called in to transport the patient to the closest and appropriate hospital. If the injury or illness needs additional attention, but the patient does not require assistance in getting to a medical facility or emergency room, he/she will be given direction to said facilities. In all cases, medical bills are the responsibility of the patient, or parent/legal guardian in the case of a minor. Management assumes no responsibility for accidents on the grounds.

The first aid center will be open Monday – Thursday 10 a.m. – 11 p.m. and Friday-Saturday 10 a.m. – 12 a.m. (midnight).

# **CAMPING**

# Pre-fair camping (July 17 and earlier)

For pre-fair activities occurring at the Ohio State Fair on or before July 17, camping is available on a first-come, first-served basis. **Reservations are NOT accepted, or needed.** Camping permits are available at a cost of \$50 per day and can be purchased upon arrival at the main entrance gate. If your stay will overlap through July 18 or later, you <u>must</u> make a reservation online. Please note the spot you have reserved for July 18 or later so that you can plan to stay in the same spot, if available, during your stay July 17 and earlier. If you do not make advance reservations for stays on or after July 18, you may be required to relocate or remove your camper, as your space may be reserved for another visitor.

# **IMPORTANT**

If you receive premiums of \$499 and over, the State of Ohio *now* requires *you* to register as a "new supplier" at www.supplier.obm.ohio.gov. This *MUST* be done before any payment will be processed. Please be aware you will be asked for banking information, as your *payment* will be *direct deposit*. You may use either a checking or savings account.

If you have won \$499 and over in the past, you do **not** need to register. However, **you are responsible** to make any address or name changes, by going to www.supplier.obm.ohio.gov and update you information.

If you need assistance with the online processes, please call the "help desk" at 1-877-644-6771.

The use of Golf Carts, Side-by-Sides, or other similar all-terrain vehicles during the Ohio State Fair is limited to special circumstances where a need has been demonstrated, and only when an Ohio State Fair Golf Cart Permit has been issued. Golf Cart Permit Applications must be completed and submitted by July 1, 2022.

Any Permit holder found in violation of any policy pertaining to golf cart use will automatically forfeit their golf cart permit as well as be subject to golf cart confiscation by the State Highway Patrol. The golf cart will be confiscated and the owner must remove the cart from the fair no later than midnight on the day of the impoundment. Owner/applicant will be held responsible.

A 2022 permit must be attached to the front of the cart AND REMAIN CLEARLY VISIBLE AT ALL TIMES.

All golf carts must be registered with the Fiscal Office by completing the Golf Cart Application.

Golf cart permit applications will only be reviewed for those who have submitted both:

A copy of auto liability insurance and

A copy of the driver's license(s) for all approved drivers Golf carts can be operated ONLY by a pre-approved, licensed driver. Golf carts can be driven ONLY on the blue line. Between 10 a.m. and midnight, carts are allowed on the blue golf cart route only as indicated by the dotted line on the included map. This path is designed with the safety of the fairgoer in mind.

Carts must be kept secure at all times, especially at night. Drivers must be 16 years or older and have a valid driver's license.

Carts must be operated in a safe manner and ONLY BY PRE-APPROVED, LICENSED DRIVERS.

Drivers and passengers are not allowed to consume alcoholic beverages on carts.

Golf cart speed limit is 10 mph.

Having more individuals in a golf cart or side-by-side than seats in the vehicle is strictly prohibited.

Carts are for official use only. No joyriding or racing will be allowed.

When parking your cart, be careful to avoid blocking access to concessions, walkways, or roadways.

Carts are not permitted on the grassy areas of the grounds. Cart rules apply to dates starting Monday, July 11 and ending Sunday, August 7.
