Cattle may be released after their breed shows are completed – only with prior approval from the OSF Dairy Office and proper release forms.

The Ohio State Fair Dairy Cattle Division will follow the National PDCA and the Ohio Department of Agriculture Rules on Show Ring Code of Ethics.

A Drug Use Notification Form will be required to be completed for all lactating dairy cows, from which a test sample is collected. Testing may be conducted by ODA on breed Grand Champions and Reserve Grand Champions. An ultrasonographic evaluation may be conducted on the first and second place cows in milking classes. Exhibitors and/or leaders of cows required to have an ultrasonographic evaluation will be notified prior to leaving the show ring, and all qualified cows must be presented to the ultrasonographic area immediately following the show. The ultrasonographic evaluation must be completed prior to milking. Testing may be conducted by ODA on the first and second place cows in a breed futurity show held at a time other than the scheduled breed show.

Through the courtesy of **Select Sires Member Cooperative** show programs and youth show shirts will be provided.

NOTE PROCEDURE— All entries close June 21 by 1 pm.

- 1. All junior class entries are required to provide the information on the online entry for each animal entered.
- 2. Each exhibitor will be permitted an in-class substitution and one (1) wild card substitution will be permitted.
- 3. All junior dairy exhibitors are subject to "General Rules and Regulations". Note especially that all animals are to be owned by and in the complete custody and under care of the exhibitor on or before May 22. Ownership means date of record.
- 4. Only two (2) animals per class can be shown by any exhibitor.
- 5. For entering Showmanship, enter Division 209. Showmanship is shown based on the exhibitors age as of January 1, 2024. All animals in showmanship classes must be shown with assigned show harness numbers. The animal used for showmanship must be one entered and shown by the exhibitor in breeding classes. All dairy showmen must wear white trousers, and show sponsored t-shirts are preferred, however, white shirts may be worn. This dress code shall be followed in all individual breeding classes as well as showmanship classes.

- 6. After the identity of each animal has been verified, papers will be filed in the Dairy Cattle office until the conclusion of the breed show. All papers will be returned to each exhibitor, or appropriate representative, prior to release of cattle.
- 7. Breed representatives will check registration papers to verify animal identification and ownership after the exhibitor has verified entries with office staff. Registration papers will be held in the Dairy Cattle office until the conclusion of the show.
- 8. Cattle registered in alternate, supplemental or parallel herd books shall be eligible to show according to the current guidelines established by each Breed Association relative to their respective national shows. For example, this may include Holstein cattle which have reached "Qualified" status.
- 9. Fitting Junior Show Animals Junior exhibitors must fit their own animals for the junior show. Assistance, if needed, may be supplied prior to the junior show by the following members of the exhibitor's immediate family (parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, brothers or sisters) or another junior member while on the Ohio State Fairgrounds. Such persons must be registered with the department's management and only one person may be registered per animal. 4-H advisors and FFA instructors may instruct only.
- 10. Junior Exhibitors must show their own animals. Exceptions will be made only for exhibitors who may be physically impaired, who have multiple animals entered in the same class, or an exhibitor absent on show day due to other commitments. In case of these exceptions another boy or girl who is eligible to be an Ohio Junior Division Exhibitor may exhibit the animal with the authorization of the department director. If a Junior Fair Livestock Exhibitor cannot be present at the time of judging the exhibitor will need to present to the department director a written permission notice signed by the football coach, band director or any other person in charge of an activity that is in conflict and prevents the exhibitor from being present at the time of judging. This notice must be on official letterhead of the organization and given to the department director 24 hours before show day and must include name, county, birthdate, home phone number, and complete address of the exhibitor's, home and work of the person in charge of the event (i.e. football coach, band director, etc.) Also include a brief description of the conflict.
- 11. HERD UNIT—If a herd is registered in the names of the immediate members of a family, these persons may combine their entries as a "Herd Unit" and be considered as one exhibitor. Fees which are paid at time of entry must reflect these entry numbers for the "Herd Unit". Individual entries may not be combined into a "Herd Unit" at a later time. In order to qualify as a "Herd Unit", all animals must be kept in the same herd.
 - a. An animal owned by any person in the Herd Unit may be substituted for one owned by any other person in the "Herd Unit".
 - b. Any animal bred by any of the members of the Herd Unit will be considered as having been bred by the "Herd Unit"; unless it is being exhibited by another outside partner.
 - c. Ownership recorded in the name of the herd unit or any member of the herd unit must be indicated on the entry blank as a partnership for that junior exhibitor.
- 12. Premiums will not be paid unless the registration number of breeding animals is furnished prior to

show.

- 13. Every female over 24 months old must have produced a living calf within 12 months or prove to be with calf. A free martin heifer shall be barred from showing until she has become of such age as to have proven a breeder.
- 14. At the request of the dairy cattle management, exhibitors may be required to furnish cattle for judging contests.
- 15. Certificate of ownership and identification according to the breed organizations will be required before showing of animals. All tattoos, identification of animals and registration papers will be checked prior to showing. It will be required by the Fair Management for the Breed Associations to check registration papers for ownership and the proper showing of cattle in their respective classes. Cattle registered in alternate, supplemental or parallel herd books shall be eligible to show according to the current guidelines established by each Breed Association relative to their respective national shows
- 16. Cows shown in dry classes will be reported by show management to their respective breed associations and to the appropriate DHIA officials for testing within the state of each exhibitor as having been shown as a dry cow on show date.
- 17. Any breed failing to exhibit a total of 40 animals or more each year in a three-year period will be cause for discontinuing that breed in future shows.
- 18. A milk out shall be left to the judge's discretion.
- 19. Exhibitors shall not water animals at hydrants, cattle must be watered in stalls.
- 20. The use of automatic straw shredders will not be permitted.
- 21. Stalling Space—Stalling space is assigned based on the number of head paid for and entered by the exhibitor. If the exhibitor wishes to put up a display, please note on the stalling request form, so additional space can be allocated. All stalls are assigned by the Dairy Department personnel. Exhibitors must check for correct stall assignments before bedding down. Exhibits incorrectly located will need to move to the assigned area. NOTE—If animals are to arrive at the Ohio State Fair <u>before</u> or <u>after</u> scheduled arrival time, or if you are unable to exhibit, please notify the Dairy Department Management by calling 614-644-4498 (between July 21-August 4).

RULES GOVERNING HANDLING OF MILK

The Ohio State Fair Management will make every effort to provide dairy exhibitors satisfactory facilities and service in the handling of milk at the Ohio State Fair.

Milking machines will be provided in the parlor only and a dumping station is provided for those who milk in the stall.

Milk handled at the Ohio State Fair will be used for human consumption. Samples will be checked daily

for the presence of antibiotics and the tank will be sampled for a bacteria count. Any exhibitor supplying milk in which antibiotics are found will be barred from selling milk the remaining days of the fair and will be held responsible for any milk that is dumped.

The milking parlor will be under the direction of the supervisor in charge. To maintain sanitary equipment, there will always be hot water and cleansing agents available while the parlor and dump station are open. Only clean equipment will be accepted and must be checked by a representative of the Ohio Department of Agriculture prior to the first milking at the fair. Times that the representative will be available will be posted in the parlor area. All such equipment must be washed after each milking in the dump station area. Milk cans will not be supplied by the fair management. All milk shall be delivered in clean, hooded pails or cans and must be free of foreign matter! Any animal that is milked in the milking parlor area must be free of manure.

Each exhibitor will be asked to complete and sign a Milk Agreement Form prior to the first milking. Information contained on the form is important for the state fair management, the supervisor of the parlor, and payment for milk sold during the fair.

With any and all of the above guidelines, the supervisor and personnel of the parlor and dumping station will be in charge of all decisions regarding the cleanliness of the cows and the equipment. Their recommendations and/or instructions shall be followed. Unsatisfactory results could lead to immediate termination of milking privileges.

Milk will be received on all days between the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. For move-in days of each session and the last day of the fair, please listen closely for announcements, or ask management for the times the parlor and dump station will be available.

On show days, follow the schedules that will be posted in the parlor area, the dairy office door, and locations throughout the barn. Every effort will be made to maintain flexible hours for exhibitors prior to and following shows. Dairy office announcements will alert exhibitors 30 minutes prior to the parlor closing.

It is very important to remember that spectators are observing every phase of our operation. It is crucial that we make a good impression if we are to maintain positive communication with consumers. No injections can be given in the parlor.

Dumping milk down drains may result in the lose of premiums. Milk is only to be dumped in the marked locations or at the direction of parlor staff.

CAMPING

Due to limited space for the 2024 Ohio State Fair camping will go to a lottery system. All camping reservations will be for Livestock Exhibitors only in 2024. Entries will be verified after the entry deadline on June 21 at 1 p.m. If you do not have entries you will be contacted to release your spot and receive a refund. All camp spots are full hook up and located in Korbel North. The camping lottery form will be available from May 6 - May 17. The first round of lottery winners will be contacted via email the week of May 27. Winners will receive emailed directions of how to pay for their spot. It is your responsibility to be checking your email, including the junk/spam folders. The second round of lottery winners will be contacted via email the week of June 3. If there is a need for further lottery winners to be contacted this will take place the week of June 10. Please read the 2024 Camping Rules listed below:

Reservation limits/subleasing

Each person may make no more than one (1) site reservation. Reservations are for the individual who placed the reservation and their associated camper/vehicle only for the length of time necessary. "Subleased" spots, in which the individual making the reservation allows a third party to later occupy his or her spot after he or she exits the Ohio State Fair, are strictly prohibited. This means that individuals cannot make a reservation, stay for a portion of the leased time, pull out and then let his or her friend pull in. Violators may be towed and prohibited from booking future camping reservations.

Hours and check-in/check-out

- Campground is open from July 15 Aug. 4, 2024.
- All campers must vacate campground no later than 6 p.m. on Aug. 5, 2024.
- Check-in time begins at 3 p.m. If RV/camper will be late on arrival, they must notify the camping office at 614-644-4191 no later than 6 p.m. on the day of check-in. Otherwise, the reservation will be forfeited the following day and an automatic one-night charge of \$60 will apply. The remaining reservation amount will be refunded to the original form of payment.
- Check-out time is no later than noon. All campers must exit the campgrounds no later than noon on their scheduled departure date. Check-in and check-out times will be strictly enforced. Guests who do not move their camper by the required check-out time will automatically be assessed a \$100 penalty. Violators will be towed. Please see below for information on extended stays.
- The campgrounds will be patrolled. If a purchased spot is found to be vacant or being leased to another camper fraudulently using another owner's permit and reservation, both violators may be prohibited from booking future camping reservations.

Please be aware you will be asked for banking information, as your payment will be direct deposit. You may use either a checking or savings account. If you have won \$499 or more in the past, and have already set up a supplier account, you do not need to register again. However, you are responsible for making any address or name changes, by going to https://ohiopays.ohio.gov/ and updating any necessary information. The use of Golf Carts, Side-by-Sides, or other similar all-terrain vehicles, is limited to golf carts, gators or similarly manufactured vehicles. Use of ATV's that do not meet those listed are not allowed. Use is limited to special circumstances where a need has been demonstrated (such as delivering feed to

animals, trash removal, or on-grounds delivery to vendor booth locations during restricted hours), and only when an Ohio State Fair Golf Cart Permit has been issued. No vehicles with performances packages are permitted. All other electric or motorized vehicles are prohibited, including but not limited to: electric or motorized scooters, motorized bicycles, mini-bikes, slingshot trikes, dune buggies, hoverboards, and Segways.

Violators will have their vehicle confiscated and impounded.

Any Permit holder found in violation of any policy pertaining to golf cart use will automatically forfeit their golf cart permit as well as be subject to golf cart confiscation by the Ohio State Highway Patrol. The golf cart will be confiscated, and the owner must remove the cart from the Fair no later than midnight on the day of the impoundment. Owner/applicant will be held responsible.

Permit applications are due June 21 at 1 p.m.

All golf carts must be registered with the Ohio Expo Center & State Fair Finance Office by completing the Golf Cart Application. New this year, golf cart permits must be pre-ordered online during the entry process which closes June 21, 2024 at 1 p.m. Payment for the permit will be required at the time of purchase on the entry site. 2024 golf cart permits will cost \$30 per day or \$300 for the full fair. NO ONSITE GOLF CART SALES WILL TAKE PLACE IN 2024.

A 2024 permit must be attached to the front of the cart AND REMAIN CLEARLY VISIBLE AT ALL TIMES. Golf cart permit applications will only be reviewed for those who have submitted the following via the Ohio State Fair Website:

- A copy of auto liability insurance and
- A copy of the driver's license(s) for all approved drivers
- A golf cart information form (Google Form)

Rules and Restrictions

- Cart rules apply to dates starting Monday, July 15 and ending Sunday, August 4.
- Golf carts can be operated in a safe manner ONLY by a pre-approved, licensed driver. Drivers must be 16 years or older and have a valid driver's license.

- Golf carts can be driven ONLY on the blue line shuttle path around the perimeter of the grounds
 as indicated by the dotted line on the included map between 10 a.m. and midnight. This path is
 designed with the safety of the fairgoer in mind.
- Carts must be kept secure at all times, especially at night.
- Drivers and passengers are not allowed to consume alcoholic beverages on carts.
- Golf cart speed limit is 10 mph.
- Having more individuals in a golf cart or side-by-side than seats in the vehicle is strictly prohibited.
- Carts are for official use only.
- No joyriding or racing will be allowed.
- When parking your cart, be careful to avoid blocking access to concessions, walkways, doorways, or roadways.
- Carts are not permitted anywhere beyond the blue shuttle path, including on the grassy areas of the grounds and the paved path between the Bricker Building and the Gilligan Complex.
- VIOLATION OF ANY OF THE ABOVE RULES WILL RESULT IN IMMEDIATE AND FINAL REVOCATION OF PERMIT & CART AND APPLICANT WILL BE HELD RESPONSIBLE.

Additional Items to Note

- Admission and Parking starts on July 24, 2024 and extends until August 4, 2024.
- Parking is in the area designated on the back of the specific pass purchased. If you are parked in the wrong location for your pass vehicle is subject to being towed.
- If the parking area noted on your pass is full additional free parking is available North of 17th
 Avenue.
- Purchased admission and parking will be mailed in early July. Junior Fair Exhibitors will receive
 tickets for the days they are required to be on the fairgrounds upon check in with the respective
 barn of their entries.
- Livestock trailer parking is available North of 17th Avenue free of charge on a first come first serve basis. Livestock trailer parking is limited so please be courteous of others when parking.

Feed, Bedding and Supplies

First Bedding will be furnished for beef, poultry, and rabbits. Sawdust and sand are not to be used for bedding, due to the difficulty in disposing of manure containing these materials.

As a service to exhibitors, Management has contracted with a vendor to make available for purchase grain, hay, straw, and some miscellaneous supplies. The store is located under the viaduct across from the Gilligan Livestock Complex (Horse Barn). Prices must be posted and be in line with the retail market of this general trade area. All purchases made during the show must be from the feed vendor. No outside vendors will be permitted to make deliveries on the fairgrounds.

Exhibitors may provide their own feed, but are *not permitted* to sell to others, *nor* may they store feed in aisles or block aisles with service vehicles.

Exhibitors purchasing feed and bedding from the vendor must not have a remaining balance. All items should be paid for upon initial purchase. Any remaining balance with vendor will result in release slip not be given until balance is paid.

Exhibitors must keep pens and aisles clean and in order, along with keeping their animals clean and well cared for, as a part of their contribution to the Ohio State Fair. Exhibitors must place manure outside of the building in area provided for loading. Manure *must not* be left on the ramp or platform. Exhibitors neglecting to do this will be warned for the first offense. Premiums and special awards won shall be forfeited for further neglect and lack of cooperation.

Late Arrival/Early Release

One late arrival or early release will be granted per exhibitor. Late arrivals and early releases are granted for county fairs, other livestock shows, and emergency situations. In the event of a county fair or other livestock show please email your request for late arrival or early release to Andrea Hershey, Ag/Livestock Manager, at a.hershey@expo.ohio.gov. Requests must be emailed by July 15, 2024. Emergency situations will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.

Buildings and Grounds Regulations

To maintain our buildings and grounds and provide public safety the Ohio State Fair has the following regulations:

- Advertisements can not be displayed on the walls, doors, or windows of buildings.
- Signage that is hung on the building surfaces must be adhered with gaffer's tape.
- Lawn signs must be approved by Ohio State Fair management. Any signs not having prior approval will be removed.
- Ohio State Fair management reserves the right to remove signage and advertisements from any building surface.
- Tents must be staked down and adhere to the species-specific policy on location and hours of use.
- Tents can not block doorways, driveways, shuttle paths, or public traffic flow.
- Ohio State Fair is not responsible for damage to tents due to inclement weather or sudden weather changes.
- Ohio State Fair reserves the right to ask that tents be removed.

General Rules

The Ohio State Fair follows Ohio Administrative Code. Please find the Exhibition Laws and Rules at the following website: https://agri.ohio.gov/divisions/animal-health/Livestock+Exhibitions . Specifically, the Ohio Youth Livestock Exhibition Rules and Livestock Tampering Exhibition Rules.

A) DEFINITIONS

- (1) "UNETHICAL FITTING" Means to alter or change the natural appearance, weight, musculature or conformation of an animal in an unnatural or artificial manner, including but not limited to, the removal of animal tissue or body part, to cut or tear the hide, to cover, dye or color the hair or hide, to add artificial tailheads, switches, polls, hair, or heals, or to administer, feed, give or inject any substance or drug to an animal exhibited, except when medically necessary or when the drug used has been approved for such use by the Food and Drug Administration or United States Department of Agriculture.
- (2) "CLASSIFICATION" Means the eligibility requirements and qualifications for a competition of a particular breed or animal as determined by the National Association for Junior Shows or a breed association recognized by the Agricultural Director of the Ohio Expositions Commission.

(3) "IMMEDIATE FAMILY" — means a mother, father, brother, sister, grandparent, uncle, or aunt of an exhibitor by marriage or by law.

(B) COMPETITION ELIGIBILITY

- (1) To be eligible to participate in the Junior Division livestock shows or activities at the Ohio State Fair, an exhibitor must be a current member in good standing of either Ohio 4-H or FFA. This includes being officially enrolled, as documented by the youth organization they are a part of, in the appropriate project corresponding to the class/animal they are entering for exhibition at the Ohio State Fair.
- (2) Current Ohio 4-H and FFA member in good standing, ages 8 years old and in 3rd grade, or 9 years old regardless of grade, as of January 1. Eligibility ends December 31 the year youth turns 19.
- (3) In accordance with the Ohio Administrative Code Section 901-19-07, youth exhibiting market livestock in a terminal or partial terminal show or lactating dairy animals must complete an approved Quality Assurance Program (QA) training at least 45 days prior to the START of the exhibition (not show day), but no sooner than Oct. 1 of the previous calendar year. June 1st is the recommended deadline to complete QA for exhibition at the Ohio State Fair.
- (4) Exhibitors must present a certificate of registration from a recognized breed associations certifying that the exhibitor's entry in the Ohio State Fair meets the qualifications of the animal breed classification exhibited, with the exception of steer, crossbred gilt, barrow, market lamb, poultry, dog, saddle horse and rabbit entries. Recognition of breed associations shall be determined by the Agricultural Director of the Ohio Expositions Commission. A list of recognized breed associations shall be published or made available to the public on or before January 1st of each year. A certificate of registration must be submitted no later than opening day of the Ohio State Fair, with the exception of Simmental Junior Heifer Calf entries.
- (5) The Ohio Expositions Commission may limit the number of entries made by an exhibitor in a classification due to space limitations.
- (6) All market and breeding animals exhibited at the Ohio State Fair must be fully owned by the exhibitor as evidenced by a bill of sale or registration, including all showing rights, and in the complete custody and care of the exhibitor on or before the ownership deadline provided on the Ohio State Fair website. These dates are in accordance with the Ohio Administrative Code 901-19-39. Ownership of an animal shall be considered lost if the animal has been consigned or lost after the applicable possession deadline even if the animal is bought back by the exhibitor.
- (7) All market and lactating dairy animals must complete a Drug Use Notification Form (DUNF Form) online prior to arrival and check in at the Ohio State Fair. DUNF Forms are completed online and will be available on the Ohio State Fair website on/after July 10, 2024.

(C) ENTRY

- (1) Entry due date of June 21 at 1:00 p.m.
- (a) The junior entry must be in the Junior Exhibitor's name.
- (b) No advance entry is required to enter in person skillathon. Showmanship will be entered when making online entries and verified at check-in.

- (c) ONLINE ENTRY INFORMATION All exhibitors must enter online. Please follow directions for online entry. Enter online at www.ohiostatefair.com. Exhibitors should keep their exact login information (user name/password).
- (d) Online entries must provide information for either your FFA advisor or 4-H County Extension Professional. The junior exhibitor's entry will not be finalized until the confirmation is received back from either the FFA Advisor, or 4-H County Extension Professional.
- (2) A \$75 late fee plus regular entry fee per species will be charged for entries made June 21 at 1:01 p.m. July 15 some species late entry date may vary or late entry may not be offered, check your species rule book for more specific late entry information) NO LATE ENTRY OF JUNIOR MARKET OR BREEDING ANIMALS.
- (3) Partnerships and leases may submit entries at the Ohio State Fair if the partnership or lease was formed no later than June 1st of the same year in which an entry is made. Beef Cattle registration papers must be in the name of the junior exhibitor ONLY.
- (4) FFA Chapters may submit entries to compete in the Junior Division of the Ohio State Fair if a certificate accompanies the application from the FFA advisor which certifies that the chapter has cared for the animal since June 1st of the same year in which an entry is made, or an earlier deadline for an exhibitor participation at a County or Independent Fair during the same year in which an entry is made in the Ohio State Fair.

(D) PROHIBITED CONDUCT

- (1) No exhibitor shall enter an animal in a competition in the Junior Livestock Division of the Ohio State Fair that has not been fully owned, cared for or in the custody of the exhibitor by the listed ownership deadline.
- (2) No exhibitor shall enter an animal in a competition in the Junior Livestock Division of the Ohio State Fair that has been handled, fitted, groomed, shown, or exhibited by another person other than a registered member of the exhibitor's immediate family (parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, brother, sister) or another junior exhibitor while on the Ohio State Fairgrounds during the fair. Each exhibitor showing a market animal shall register with the Agricultural Director of the Ohio Expositions Commission or his designee upon arrival at the Ohio State Fair, the name of the person from the immediate family who will be helping the junior exhibitor.
- (3) No exhibitor shall enter an animal in a junior livestock division competition of the Ohio State Fair that has been unethically fitted in any way.
- (4) No exhibitor shall enter an animal in a junior livestock competition that is ineligible as to age for the particular classification.
- (5) No exhibitor shall falsify any information included in the online entry submitted to the Ohio State Fair.
- (6) No exhibitor shall engage in unsportsman like or disorderly conduct.
- (7) No participant shall unethically fit or alter another exhibitor's animal.

(E) PRIZES

- (1) Prizes and Premiums for each animal classification shall be determined by the Agricultural Director of the Ohio Expositions Commission.
- (2) Prizes are subject to forfeiture by an exhibitor for violations of the Junior Livestock Division rules and regulations upon a final determination of a violation pursuant to paragraph H of this rule.

(F) EXHIBITOR RESPONSIBILITY

The exhibitor shall be the absolute insurer of and shall be responsible for the condition of an animal exhibited at the Ohio State Fair Junior Livestock Competitions, regardless of the acts of a third party. Should the testing and inspection procedures used by the Ohio Expositions Commission evidence the presence of a foreign substance or any drug not medically necessary or not approved for such use by the Food and Drug Administration or United States Department of Agriculture, the exhibitor, a member of the exhibitor's immediate family or any other person shown to have had care, custody or attendance of the animal in any way, at the discretion of the Ohio Expositions Commission, may be subjected to the penalties provided for in paragraph (I) of this rule.

(G) TESTING AND INSPECTION OF ANIMALS

- (1) The General Manager of the Ohio Expositions Commission or his designated agent may conduct testing or inspection of any and all animals entered in a junior livestock division competition before, during or after the competition to carry out the following purposes:
- (a) To determine whether an animal qualifies for competition in a particular breed classification;
- (b) To determine whether the animal has been unethically fitted in any manner;
- (c) To determine whether any false information or representation was made in a competition entry;
- (2) All animals entered in the junior livestock division are subject to inspection or testing by the Ohio Department of Agriculture pursuant to Title IX of the Revised Code, or any rules or regulations promulgated there under.

(I) PENALTIES

- (1) An exhibitor determined to have violated these rules may be subject to the following penalties at the discretion of the General Manager;
- (a) Forfeiture of prize money;
- (b) Forfeiture of sale money;
- (c) A person proven to have violated any rule may be barred from competing at future competitions at the Ohio State Fair.

(J) SHOW

- (1) Exhibitors must show their own animals, except in the following circumstances:
- (a) The exhibitor is impaired

- (b) The exhibitor has two entries in the same class
- (c) The exhibitor presents a copy of the online entry receipt or other documentation establishing the need for an early release or late arrival to the Agricultural Director of the Ohio Expositions Commission or his designee in advance of the show date
- (d) The exhibitor shall be granted only one early release or late arrival depending on species.

(K) PROTESTS

- (1) Protests regarding any junior livestock competition shall be in writing and signed by the party making the protest.
- (2) Protests regarding any junior livestock competition shall be submitted to the General Manager of the Ohio Expositions Commission no later than twelve noon of the day following the competition.
- (3) Any party making a protest shall submit a fee of one hundred dollars to the Ohio Expositions Commission. The fee shall be refunded only if the protest is sustained by the Ohio State Fair General Manager.
- (4) The General Manager of the Ohio Expositions Commission shall hold a meeting regarding the protest at which time the party making protest may present evidence or argument in support of the protest.
- (5) The written decision of the General Manager shall be final and shall be served by mail to the party making the protest within ten days of the date on which the protest was heard.

(L) PARTIAL TERMINAL SHOW

(1) All market animals that win their division as grand champion or reserve grand champion shall be slaughtered upon their sale. The exhibitor shall release the animal to the care and custody of the Agricultural Director of the Ohio Expositions Commission or his designee on the date and time designated by the Agriculture Director. The exhibitor shall maintain absolute responsibility and care or custody of the animal until such date and time as the animal is released to the Agricultural Director.
